Moved by Evans, seconded by Lauer, that this Committee recommends to Council that as recommended in a report dated November 16, 1999 from the Engineering Department, since significant improvements have been made to improve intersection safety at this location, that staff continue to monitor the intersection;

AND THAT no action be taken at this time to install a four-way stop and additional flashing red lights at the intersection of Matchedash Street and Neywash Street;

AND THAT By-law Number 1983-80 be amended to allow parking restrictions at intersections to be increased up to 30m approach and 20m departure side. Carried.

Moved by Lauer, seconded by Shaw, that this Committee recommends to Council that the City is not prepared to make a decision on the extension of services from the City of Orillia to the subdivision proposed by Mark Rich Homes Limited, File No. 43T-99006 at this time, pending an examination of the policy implication and methods of implementation of such an extension. Carried.

Moved by Kirby, seconded by Lauer, that this Committee recommends to Council that the Ontario Municipal Board be advised that the City of Orillia is not prepared to extend services to Area 2, as described in Report No. PD-99-048, dated November 26, 1999, from the Planning and Development Department, (Mark Rich Homes Ltd. proposed subdivision – Severn Township), as this would facilitate a density of development which the City considers to be inappropriate for this location and for the intervening lands between Areas 2 and 3, as set out in the report. Carried.
