SCOUT VALLEY

Located between Highway 11, Old Barrie and Line 15 North, Orillia's environmental heritage park, Scout Valley, offers recreational opportunities in all four seasons.

Visit throughout the year for walking, hiking, birding, cross-country skiing, snowshoeing or just enjoying the natural environment. There is a choice of three loop trails of varying degrees of difficulty and length to suit participants of every age and agility.

A recently built trail from the parking lot on Memorial Avenue in addition to parking lots on Old Barrie Road and Line 15 North provide easy access. Maps are posted at each of the parking lots.

Motorized Vehicles are Prohibited on the Trails

with the exception of Personal Mobility Devices
(Motorized Wheelchairs and Medical Scooters)

Please remember that motorized vehicles are prohibited on the municipal trail system with the exception of personal mobility devices.

Limited-speed motorcycles, motor-assisted bicycles (moped), pocket bikes, electric and motorized scooters and segway scooters are not allowed on the trail system in addition to the large motorized vehicles such as cars, trucks, snowmobiles, ATVs, dirt bikes etc ...

New types of alternative vehicles are becoming more mainstream. Please consult with the City of Orillia By-Law Enforcement by calling (705) 325-2313 prior to purchasing these types of vehicles to find out if they are allowed in your neighbourhood or on the trail system.

TREES

There are two planting times per year in the spring and the fall. Requests for a spring planting must be received by March 1st and for a fall planting by August 1st. Once you have decided to proceed with a tree donation, it is advisable to schedule a site visit to discuss the type (species) of tree and location opportunities.

The City plants a number of different tree species and varieties that are considered appropriate for various locations in our parks. Each tree type must be considered in its specific location. Our City Arborist will help you select a tree that suits a desired location.

LOOK what we are doing to meet your requests!

The Parks and Recreation Department will open all athletic fields on **May 1, 2010**. We request your assistance in keeping teams and others off the fields prior to this date so we can provide the safest, highest quality fields possible.

If unusually wet conditions cause us to delay the use of some or all of the athletic fields we will place an ad on the City's web site and in the Orillia Packet and Times - City Hall Bulletin Board prior to the scheduled opening date.

FOR YOUR INFORMATION

If the fields are wet the main reasons for a delay are: the calcine clay infield is designed to absorb water, however when it is saturated, the water remains on the infield creating a slippery, greased like surface. Even with cleats, this becomes a health and safety issue.

Usage of turf areas when wet cause turf to be torn out. These areas become rutted and invaded with weeds which lowers the quality of the turf. Please help us ensure your use of safe, high-quality fields as early as possible.

Naming/Renaming Athletic Fields

Council and Members of the Recreation Advisory Committee have decided that existing and future athletic fields should perhaps be named/re-named after Orillians who have made 'extraordinary contributions' to the sports of ball or soccer. The criterion for selection would be participation, building, or volunteering within our community. Nominations are submitted to the Recreation Advisory Committee for consideration. (Written submissions must clearly demonstrate that an individual meets the criteria.) The Recreation Advisory Committee will then summarize their recommendation in a report to Council.

Naming/Renaming City Parks

Council and the Recreation Advisory Committee have decided that existing and future parks should perhaps be named/renamed after Orillians who have made "extraordinary contributions" to Orillia. The onus is on the person/group submitting the suggestion to prove the worthiness of the nominee and convince the Recreation Advisory Committee that the contribution of the nominee is extraordinary and fits the rationale. Nominations are submitted to the Recreation Advisory committee for consideration. The Recreation Advisory Committee will then summarize their recommendation in a report to Council. Couchiching Beach Park & Centennial Park

Couchiching Beach Park has a summer supervised sandy beach and two playgrounds. The waterfront park is a beehive of activity from mid-May until mid-October including many special events and Sunday Evening Band Concerts.

J.B. Tudhope Memorial Park

J.B. Tudhope Memorial Park on Lake Couchiching is an active park for baseball and boasts a volleyball court and a 2.5 km paved walking loop. Within this Park, Moose Beach has a summer supervised swimming area, and playground apparatus.

Kitchener Park

Kitchener Park, located on Lake Simcoe, is an active centre for sports enthusiasts as well as spectators to enjoy soccer, baseball, tennis and horseshoes. Acres of green grass and a playground centre invite children to enjoy the park as well.

McKinnel Square Park

Many hours are enjoyed at this lively location where baseball runs continuously for minor and adult levels. The park playground area includes play apparatus, a splash pad, a washroom and meeting room facility.

Rental of over 1200 square metres is available during the non-ice season for parties or special events as well as lounge rental with bar, food, banquet options, and handicapped access.

Brian Orser Arena

During the winter; much of the scheduling is comprised of the Orillia Figure Skating Club, Orillia Minor Hockey, Orillia Girls Hockey League, local schools, recreational hockey leagues and casual renters. Public skating is scheduled for most Sunday afternoons and seasonal holidays. Family skating is held on most Saturday evenings. Summer users include Orillia Minor Lacrosse Association, Summer Hockey School and InLine Hockey.

Orillia Community Centre

The Orillia Community Centre reopened for the fall of 2009. The Orillia Community Centre is located on Penetang Street and is used primarily in the winter months by Orillia Minor Hockey, recreational hockey leagues, local schools and casual renters. Public skating is offered most Sunday afternoons and during special holidays. The auditorium will accommodate up to 234 people for booster clubs, dances, banquets and meetings. Summer users include the Orillia Minor Lacrosse Association and various roller hockey and ball hockey teams and tournaments as well as casual renters. This facility is also used for various community events such as the Circus, Rock Concerts, rain location for outdoor events, etc.

Meeting Rooms

The Dr. Tom Brandl and the Mr. Blair Ashmore rooms in Brian Orser Arena and the McKinnel Square Meeting Room are available, free of charge for local non-profit community groups for a limited number of hours/week (\$20.00 key deposit required). Two of the rooms are equipped with a boardroom table and white boards. A maximum of 30 people can be accommodated in the rooms.
